1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Analysis of Feedback: The Office of the IQAC receives Feedback in structured format from Students, Parents and Alumni as designed. In a team work IQAC makes an objective analysis of the feedback received. The analyses of the feedback received leads to the following points where they are found concerned with and hence deserve attention of the authority for necessary action.

- 1. Analysis of the feedback received from Students shows that they are happy with the teaching-learning environment of the institution and satisfied with real life exposure provided to them through Extension Activities. The students are also found satisfied with NCC and NSS services, assistance received from Poor Fund, Corpus fund, and Women Forum. They are more or less satisfied with teachers within and outside the classroom. A good number of students are not seen happy with the on line system introduced and the way the result is declared by the parent university. A few are complaining of non-accessibility of Digital Library and Video Conferencing Hall. From the analysis it also becomes clear that a good number of students are not happy with the resources of Computer Centre. The analysis reports that number of classes taken using ICT tools is still not satisfactory.
- 2. Analysis of the feedback received from Alumni lead to realisation that they are not satisfied with the way they are made involved with the institution and express their willingness to be a part of the development process of the institution. They are found happy with the Awareness programme on skill development, coaching classes offered for MA and APSC Examination.
- 3. Analysis of the feedback received from the Parents shows that they are more or less happy with the academic environment of the institution. However they are not happy with the on line system introduced by our Parent University citing the ground that it needs availability of network, expertise and cause more taxation on their part. Further they want that the classes should be introduced from 9.30 rather than 8.30. A few parents suggest for more tree plantation within the college campus while others are not happy with the front view of the college at present. A good number of parents are found not happy with the service of the office stuff.

Action Taken Report: The Authority in consultation with IQAC and RUSA committee take the following steps –

- 1. The College administration informs the poor/low performing teachers to improve their teaching skills, instructs every department and faculty to use more and more the smart boards and eresources, lays stress on counselling of students through BKBIAN Groups, takes step for installation of a better computer centre.
- 2. It is finally decided to get Alumni Association involved in the college development programmes and to increase number of their representatives in certain committees.
- 3. The College Administration motivates the office stuff to be learner centred, helpful and cooperative, prepares plan to make the front view of the college look better, instructs the Eco

club to plant more trees within the college campus and decides to set up help desk for needy students for on line submission of examination forms.

2.3.2 Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

BKBian Group mentoring: BKBian Group is one of the means of mentoring and counselling the students of Dr. B.K.B. College. In the session 2018-19 the students admitted for Major course of studies are divided into BKBian Groups. Each group is under the supervision of two teacher mentors, preferably one male and another female. Whatsapp Accounts are opened for each group and administered by teacher mentors or counsellors. The academic progress of the students, their needs and problems are understood and tried to be addressed through group and individual counselling. The mentors keep in touch with the students assigned, keep them informing schedule of scholastic and non-scholastic programme, and also about admission, test, examination, registration etc. Interestingly dropout rate in case of major course comes under control through the BKBian groups.

Every department has its own mechanism of counselling its students. The Department of Assamese is pleased to sustain its Student's Mentoring System. An alumnus of the Department Miss Tumpa Bora, M.A. in Assamese from Gauhati University, has been serving the Department as Mentor.

Under Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system at Dr. B.K.B. College Major Test, Assignment, Project Preparation, Sessional Examination and Resessional Examination (if required) are conducted. The Departments conduct the Major Tests in the beginning of the session if required and declare the name of the students who are allowed to have major in the concerned subject. Similarly the Departments get their student involved with necessary instructions in Assignment, Project Preparation and Field trip when required. The Sessional Examination, held before the Semester-End examination, is carried out as per instruction received from parent university. Minor reforms initiated by institution are as follows —

- 1. The Departments are instructed by the Academic Committee to have objective type questions in the Sessional Examiantion.
- 2. The Departments are instructed by the Academic Committee to make necessary arrangement for Resessional Examination for those students who either fail or could not appear in the Sessional Examination.
- 3. Scrutiny of answer scripts of the Sessional Examination is to be initiated.
- 4. The Departments are also instructed by the Academic Committee to declare result of the Sessional Examination within fifteen days.

 - ❖ Curriculum Development: Keeping in mind the mission and vision of the institution and needs of the students the curriculum, designed by Gauhati University, is modified with Celebration of Important Days, BKB Memorial Lecture and Award, Workshops on ICT and Drama, a good number of Awareness Programme, Extension Activities, Academic Tour, Field Study, Project Work, Invited or Popular lecture etc. It has always been tried to provide the students exposure to real life situation, to the challenges of the society and inculcate in them values of life.

- **Teaching and Learning:** Stress has been on the following aspects:
- 1. Stress on Use of ICT in the classroom, Power point presentation, use of internet and e-resources.
- 2. Innovation in teaching methods such as use of film, drama, recitation, painting, museum etc. in teaching.
- 3. Parent-Teacher Meets is arranged early in the session with a view to ensuring students' attendance throughout the session.
- 4. Project work, Field-trip and Excursion.
- 5. Invited Lecture Programme or Popular Talk.
- 6. Completion of course in time and successful conduct of examinations.
 - ❖ Examination and Evaluation: The Vice-Principal with the help of the HODs conducts the sessional examination and ensures that the result is declared within 15 days of completion of the examination. The HODs are instructed for resessional examination when found necessary. Stress has been on objective evaluation, cross checking of answer scripts and declaration of result as early as possible. A full-fledged examination committee with OC, Confidential OC and AOC is constituted for every Semester-end examination. For the last few years the college has been successfully running a Zone under Gauhati University and examined and scrutinized answer scripts in the session are submitted in time to GU. One faculty Dr. Somnath Bora is deputed to attend a workshop on Examination Reforms at ADP College, Nagaon held on February 2, 2019.
 - ❖ Research and Development: Stress has always been on research work along with teaching. IQAC keeps on encouraging the faculty members to get enrolled in the parent or in any other recognised university for Ph.D programme and to contribute to the society through their research findings. In the academic year 2018-19 a few developments in this regard are as follows —
- 1. The students having project work are trained on writing a research paper or a report by the concerned Departments.
- 2. Research Journal 'Regional Journal of Economic issues', ISSN: 2981-4558, edited by Dr. Abinash Bharali is published in July, 2018.
- 3. One faculty has availed FDP for Ph.D.
- 4. One faculty is awarded Ph.D by GU.
- 5. One faculty has submitted Ph.D Thesis at GU.
- 6. One faculty is awarded M.Phil by GU.
- 7. One faculty has presented paper in an International Seminar while the Principal has presented a paper and chaired a session in an International Seminar.
- 8. Two faculties have presented papers in and five faculties have attended National seminar.
- 9. Nineteen faculties including librarian have attended state level FDP or seminar or workshop.
- 10. A few lecturers have applied for MRP.
 - **❖ Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation**: Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution are as follows −
- 1. Library automation is continued.
- 2. 120 Textbooks and 12 reference books amounting to Rs. 37815.00 are purchased and two Journals are newly added.
- 3. NLIST is subscribed and made accessible to faculty members.
- 4. Best Library User Award to both student and faculty are given by the Library Staff.
- 5. Internet facility is made available for students in the UGC Network Centre and Library.

- 6. Seven days long Workshop on ICT is arranged at college campus.
- 7. Library, Laboratory and Academic Block are renovated with assistance from RUSA.
- 8. A good number of Laboratory equipment amounting to 13.00 lakhs are purchased.
- 9. A good number of Sports equipment amounting to 2.00 Lakhs are also procured.
 - ❖ Human Resource Management: The institution through its interface of scholastic and non-scholastic activities, extension and outreach programme, NSS and NCC activities, co-curricular activities, certificate courses aspires for all round development of the students. As a bye product of the activities it is always tried to inculcate universal and local values in our students. The faculty members are sent for OP, RC, Seminar, Workshop, FDP and encouraged to go for research work along with teaching and to contribute to the society. Salary of non-sanctioned teaching and non-teaching staff is slightly increased. A Motivational Speech is also conducted for all.

 - ❖ Admission of Students: The admission committee following rules of Assam Government and regulation of reservation conducts the admission procedure. For the academic year the total number of seats for the First Semester Major Course of study is increased. Counselling is done to get outstanding students admitted at Dr. B.K.B. College. Needy students are financially helped from Poor Fund in case of admission. All members of teaching staff are involved in the process of admission.
- 6.2.2: **Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations**: E-governance in its true sense is not implemented. However, College Website, College e-mail, IQAC e-mail, BKB College Official Whatsapp Group, BKBIAN Whatsapp Guoups, Departmental Whatsapp Groups are undoubtedly certain internet generated means used also for governance in the institution.
 - Planning and Development: Not implemented. As instructed from higher authority all works under RUSA are done through on line.
 - ❖ Administration: Initiated through Website, e-mail, whatsapp groups etc. AIHSE data are submitted through on line.
 - ❖ Finance and Accounts: Cash transaction is reduced and payment through RTGS and cheque has been preferred. Payments under RUSA are done only through PFMS.
 - ❖ Student Admission and Support: Not implemented. However, the college website, e-mails, Departmental whatsapp groups, BKBIAN Groups for Counselling are of tremendous help in supporting the student fraternity in communicating them necessary notifications, about scholastic and non-scholastic activities and availing scholarship.
 - ❖ Examination: On line submission of Registration forms and Examination forms is made compulsory by GU and result of the Semester-end examinations is made available through on line. The college office, HoDs and Students Union extends possible help to the students in overcoming any problem faced by them in this regard.

The vision of Dr. B.K.B. College, a rural institution, is to impart higher education in UG level to the cross section of learners (basically belonging to the socio-economically backward communities) at an affordable cost through a syllabus designed by the parent university and a curriculum-extension interface at our own initiative. And naturally the mission is to generate knowledge and develop cognitive abilities through well planned curriculum, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, teaching methods and evaluation procedure, to inculcate values and preserve socio-cultural identities, ensure equal development and to foster a sense of belongingness to the Nation. Dr. B.K.B. College has been accelerating its activities in the post-accreditation period towards achieving its goal through a well-planned curriculum-extension interface, infrastructural augmentation and support services. The institution, as suggested by IQAC, considers Students Support Service one distinctive area for the Academic Year 2018-19 considering poor economic background of the students enrolled for the session and decides to help the students from all possible sources. Regarding economic background of the students IQAC scrutinising the admission forms places the following data before the authority ------

- 1. Annual income Rs. 1 Lakh or below ---- 60% guardians.
- 2. Annual income above Rs. 1 Lakh but below Rs. 2 Lakhs ---- 20% guardians.

The authority gives necessary instruction to the coordinators of Corpus Fund, Poor Fund, Scholarship Cell, Women Forum, HoDs of all departments, Librarian, Sports in charge, Literary Forum, Office etc. to render help and give guidance with a view to supporting the student fraternity. Details of the Financial Support extended to students in the Academic Year 2017-18 are as stated in the **Column 5.1**. Student Support under the Head **5.1.1** Scholarship and Financial Support.

Further the HoDs and Faculty members of all departments extend possible help to their major students financially whenever required and providing books from Departmental Library and Book Bank. BKBIAN Groups for Counselling and Mentoring has been another effective means of being in contact personally with the students and the counsellors address their problems consulting with HoDs, IQAC and Principal. The Cell for Career Counselling provides coaching for APSC and guides the major students for a better career. The Yoga and Meditation Cell gives admission to 35 students for the session and a trainee Miss Ponchi Bora wins a few state levels, national and international prizes for the institution. Similarly, the Sports Cell arranges training for aspiring students in Weight Lifting and Power Lifting and wins six medals in Inter college Competition, GU. Further the Literary Forum personally guides the students interested in literary fields and wins three prizes in state level literary competition. Details of the prizes won in the field of Yoga, Sports and Literary field are stated in the **column 5.3.1** under the Head **5.3 Students Participation and Activities**. Thus, the institution with its limited infrastructure and shortage of man power and limited financial strength supports the students from all possible sources and tries to create a student friendly atmosphere where students come forward by themselves to prove their talent overcoming the limitations all around.







Best Practice 1

Title of the Best Practice: <u>Use of ICT Tools in the Classroom</u>

In changing scenario technology has become an integral part of everyone's life and Dr. B.K.B. College too realises the needs and importance of the use of technology in the classroom and hence gives stress, as suggested by IQAC, on the use of ICT tools in the classroom in the Academic year 2018-19. Information and Communication Technology, popularly known as ICT, is a technological source of knowledge and information meant to make teaching learning environment more interesting, more interactive and more learner-centred. IQAC makes it quite clear to all that ICT is merely a tool, can never be the alternative of a teacher in a classroom. The teacher with all his/her pedagogical knowledge and experiences and control over the use of technology is the key to make information or knowledge available through ICT tools in an interesting way to the target group and to make the students learn, find, explore, analyse, exchange and present information responsibly, creatively and with discrimination.

Context: Dr. B.K.B. College introduces the following ICT tools to be used in the classroom with a view to making teaching learning environment more interesting and interactive, more meaningful and effective.

- 1. Laptop: Every department of the Arts Stream Assamese, English, Economics, political Science, History, Education, Sattriya, Sociology, and Psychology and also the Commerce Stream are provided a laptop.
- 2. Smart board, Projector, Desktop and Mini Sound Modifier: Seven classrooms and the Conference Hall are equipped with Smart board, Projector, Desktop and Mini Sound Modifier.
- 3. Podium and Scanner: Three podiums and four scanners are also provided to be used in the classrooms.
- 4. Internet facility: Internet facility is made available in the Office, Library, IQAC Office, RUSA office and UGC Network Resource Centre. The Departments make internet facility available in their department using device.
- 5. UGC Network Resource Centre/Computer Centre: Internet facility is made available in the UGC Resource Network Centre/ Computer Centre where students can browse learning materials from e-resources.
- 6. Video Conferencing and Digital Library: Video Conferencing Set and Digital Library are also introduced to the institution to be used for a better teaching learning environment.
- 7. NLIST: NLIST is renewed and made accessible to every teacher so that they can go through the journals to accelerate their research work and provide materials to advanced students.
- 8. GIS Laboratory and Language Laboratory: An up-to-date GIS laboratory is in service to the students of the department of Geography. A Language laboratory, introduced earlier with grammar software, is also available.

These are the ICT tools introduced so far in the institution constituting the prime rationale behind the institution's stress on the use of ICT tools in the classrooms.

Practice: It is realised well that introducing technology alone will not change the teaching learning process as desired and hence teachers' training on use of ICT tools is encouraged.

- 1. The institution organises a Week Long ICT Workshop on 'Use of ICT Tools for Classroom Teaching' in collaboration with Electronics and ICT Academy, IIT, Guwahati on November 12-18, 2018. Twenty three faculty members of Dr. B.K.B. College join the workshop as participant. Juli Thakuria, Librarian and Debita Kemprai, Assistant professor of the college coordinate the programme.
- 2. Librarian Juli Thakuria, and Faculty Seema Sovita Das and Bishal Saikia join Workshop on 'ICT in Management of Education' at Kaliabor College, Nagaon sponsored by MHRD on May 28 and June 4, 2019.
- 3. Four faculties Mrs. Anurupa Bora, Mrs. Akashi Bhuyan, Mrs. Debita Kemprai and Miss L. Changsan attend Workshop on "ICT in Management of Education" at Nowgong College sponsored by MHRD.

The college administration also motivates the students to learn through ICT tools allowing them to use their smart phones only in the UGC Resource network centre or whenever allowed. The teachers are requested by IQAC and instructed by authority to use more and more ICT tools in the classrooms. Almost all the faculty members are seen using smart boards, giving power point presentations and provide students selective learning materials from internet sources.

Evidence of Success and Resources required: No doubt ICT tools have been used in the classrooms but the number of faculty using the tools is not satisfactory. It is noticed that almost in every department laptop is used both in administrative and academic purposes, teaching and research activities, in preparing and browsing teaching learning materials. Almost every faculty uses the smart board and takes a few classes through PPTs, draws diagram easily, analyses data, shows documentary and films and with e-resources goes beyond the text. More than fifty ppts and lots of learning materials shared are submitted to the office of the IQAC by the faculty members. In every department at least three Whatsapp Groups are seen active through which the faculty members share learning materials, ppts and materials taken from e-resources. In the department like Geography and History the practice of Google Classroom is also made available to a certain extent. The Whatsapp Groups and Google Classroom, the ppts provided, the learning materials shared, the e-books or teaching materials stored in the smart boards are the evidences of success achieved so far in this regard. The major students are seen more motivated, happy with and interested in the classes where ICT tools are used. The GIS laboratory is fully used with up to date software while the language laboratory with grammar software remains of little importance. The Digital Library is so far used only for old question papers and the Video Conferencing set is used only twice in the year. Only a few lecturers are seen interested in NLIST. Hence, Dr. B.K.B. College never claims any excellence in the use of ICT tools in the classrooms but decides to sustain it as one of the best practices on the ground that the tools increases students' motivation, connects them to reliable information sources and creates active in-class and out-class learning environment. The college administration needs to motivate the teachers, sustain their training, incorporate ICT into curriculum and make it a culture of the institution.

Best Practice 2

Title of the Best practice: Health Awareness and Anti-Tobacco Campaign

Health Awareness refers to the development of one's understanding of one's mental and physical condition. In a rural educational institute like Dr. B.K.B. College 'Awareness' is a learning process that involves a growing understanding of the self and 'Health Awareness' is a paradox of understanding potential factors that make our lives vulnerable to illness. Here lies relevance of anti-tobacco campaign.

Context: Dr. B.K.B. College has been trying its best to make the students understand the importance of sound body, mind and soul collectively called health. The institution owns a Health Centre only with First Aid facility headed by Dr. Kamal Ch. Saikia and Dr. Mustahid Hazarika whose business is to give suggestion to students-patients in case of emergency and to take him/her immediately to the nearby Puranigudam State Dispensary for treatment. The college administration ensures cleanliness of the college campus throughout the session. It is always tried to keep the classrooms, lavatories, canteen clean and hygienic. Pure drinking water is made available to the students through installation of water purifiers. Yoga and **Meditation** Cell gives admission to 35 students and trains the interested ones to be physically and mentally fit. GSLI scheme is another facility provided by the institution covering all students enrolled for the session 2018-19. The college also owns a **Zymkhana** providing opportunity to the students to remain physically fit. NSS and NCC are the two main properties of the institution for keeping our students physically and mentally fit through programmes undertaken. BKBIAN Group for Counselling and Mentoring is another cell of the institution under which a few Groups are working with Counsellors with a view to addressing needs and problems of the major students admitted to the groups. Considering such impact factors Dr. B.K.B. College with its limited infrastructure places Health Awareness and Anti-Tobacco Campaign as a best practice for the session 2018-19.



'Swach Hi Seva' and 'Tobacco Control and Cancer Prevention' rally organised at Borchungihar, Model Village of Dr. B.K.B. College enjoys spontaneous participation of the community. The programme 'Tobacco Control and Cancer Prevention' organised at college premises inspires our students to discard tobacco from their life and society, similarly the same programme organised at RKB H.S. School, Puranigudam shows involvement of the students of our prime feeding centre with same spirit. What is more a students of Dr. B.K.B.
