<p><b>Analysis of Feedback:</b> The Office of the IQAC has introduced online Feedback system through college website from this session. Analysis of the feedback received from Students shows that they are happy with the teaching-learning environment of the institution and satisfied with real life exposure provided to them through Extension Activities. The students are also found satisfied with NCC and NSS services, assistance received from Poor Fund, Corpus fund, and Women Forum. They are more or less satisfied with teachers within and outside the classroom. They want up gradation of quality of canteen food. They</p>

are finding it difficult to cope up with the present online system. 2. Analysis of the feedback received from Alumni express their willingness to be a part of the development process of the institution. They are found happy with the Awareness programme, extended activities program, lecture cum Webinar organised by the college. 3. Analysis of the feedback received from the Parents shows that they are satisfied with the academic environment of the institution. They are happy with free admission procedure. 4. Analysis of the feedback received from Students on Teachers shows that they are highly satisfied by the services rendered by the teachers. Action Taken Report: The Authority in consultation with IQAC and RUSA committee take the following steps - 1. It is finally decided to get Alumni Association involved in the college development programmes and to increase number of their representatives in certain committees. 2. BKBian Group mentoring: BKBian Group is one of the means of mentoring and counselling the students of Dr. B.K.B. College. In the session 2019-20 under the guidance of Vice-Principal, Dr. Nakul ch. Sarma, the students admitted for Major course of studies are divided into BKBian Groups. Total major students for this session is 473. so, the mentor mentee ratio for the same will be 1:30. Each group is under the supervision of two teacher

mentors, preferably one male and another female. Whatsapp Accounts are opened for each group and administered by teacher mentors or counsellors. The academic progress of the students, their needs and problems are understood and tried to be addressed through group and individual counselling. The mentors keep in touch with the students assigned, keep them informing schedule of scholastic and non-scholastic programme, and also about admission, test, examination, registration etc. Interestingly dropout rate in case of major course comes under control through the BKBian groups. Every department has its own mechanism of counselling its students. Note: The mentor mentee ratio for major students is 1:30 according to BKBian group but in the column below ratio for all the students of the institutions are to be filled.

The Departments are instructed by the Academic Committee to have objective type questions in the Sessional Examination. 2. The



Departments are instructed by the Academic Committee to make necessary arrangement for Resessional Examination for those students who either fail or could not appear in the Sessional Examination. 3. Scrutiny of answer scripts of the Sessional Examination is to be initiated. The Departments are also instructed by the Academic Committee to declare result of the Sessional Examination within fifteen days.

**BEST PRACTICE - I Title:** Initiatives on spreading knowledge and awareness of the community towards Covid -19 virus in Puranigudam area. **Aim:** Spreading awareness and preparedness towards Covid-19 among general public in Puranigudam. **Method:** House to house campaign conducted by staffs of the college along with Students' union Dr.B.K.B College,Puranigudam. **Content:** As the global threat of Covid-19 continues to emerge,it is critical to improve the awareness and preparedness of the targeted community members,especially the less educated ones. As the intervention of educational institute are urgently required, the staffs of Dr.B.K.B College and Students' Union took the initiatives to reach out the general rural public of Puranigudam and conducted House to House awareness campaign on 19th March,2019.The general public were made aware of this deadly virus which was life threatening and it could affect anyone irrespective of age. The most vulnerable category were the one people including the elderly, people with weak immune systems, those with heart problems and

diabetic patients. Besides these, preventive and protective measures or steps to prevent the virus were talk-about. Covid-19 personal protective equipment like Dettol soap, hand sanitizer, Mask were also distributed. Evidence of Success: Altogether 30 to 40 houses could be reached out in the campaign. The general public highly benefitted from the campaign and it was satisfactory to learn that the general public of Puranigudam had acquired satisfactory knowledge of the main mode of disease transmission and the common symptoms of Covid-19 that transmission is via droplets from sneezing or coughing and from contaminated surfaces. Changes were seen in the lifestyle of the general public maintaining distance and hygiene. The simple practice of wearing Mask and hand washing with soap and clean water became very popular custom.

**BEST PRACTICE-II**  
**Title:** E-Learning cum Online Classes **Aims:** To facilitates the use of e-learning in teaching learning and provide opportunity of Online Classes during the pandemic. **Context:** The continuous advancement in the field of ICT and internet has made multiple mode of e-learning possible. The pandemic of Covid-19 rang the bell of practically use the ICT resources in form of E-Learning and Online classes. Dr.B.K.B. College being situated in rural societal set up, the exposure of e- learning and online classes is a boon at the same time challenge for the teaching-learning.The e-learning and ICT has been used in complementary way of teaching and learning. The pandemic has change the paradigm and exposure of Online teaching-learning to adopt and learn in regular basis. **Practice:** Each Department of Dr.B.K.B College has conducted classes on online mode via Goggle classroom, Google Meet, Zoom Cloud Meeting and Whatsapp. The classes are conducted regularly via these online modes. The study materials and PPTs' are provided via Whatsapp group and email. The students apart from doing regular classes, has also submit assignments in online mode. **Evidence of Success and problem encounter:**Such a practice help the students for continuing the studies in the time of pandemic and also help in creating interactive teaching learning. This practice also enrich the teaching learning process even in post pandemic times. Though this practice has immensely benefitted the teaching-learning community, the inadequacy of digital infrastructures has challenged such practice. Apart from the electricity and internet connectivity, it brought to light lack of inclusive education, scarcity of trained teachers etc.

of Corpus Fund, Poor Fund, Scholarship Cell, Women Forum, HoDs of all departments, Librarian, Sports in charge, Literary Forum, Office etc. to render help and give guidance with a view to supporting the student fraternity. Further the HoDs and Faculty members of all departments extend possible help to their major students financially whenever required and providing books from Departmental Library and Book Bank. BKBian Groups for Counselling and Mentoring has been another effective means of being in contact personally with the students and the counsellors address their problems consulting with HoDs, IQAC and Principal. Thus, the institution with its limited infrastructure and shortage of man power and limited financial strength supports the students from all possible sources and tries to create a student friendly atmosphere where students come forward by themselves to prove their talent overcoming the limitations all around.
