Introduction:

Gender sensitization aims to educate people about the differences between sex and gender, how gender is generated socially and gender stereotypes. Gender equity recognizes the individual needs of each gender and address them in an intersectional manner that can redress the gross imbalances created between the male female binary. It attempts to facilitate equal opportunities for all genders to overcome their socio-cultural, economical disadvantages and individual needs.

1. Curricular Aspect:

Curricular, teaching and learning all play a key role to uphold the quality and equity. Curricular aspect of gender equity is introduced by an institution to define a set of values and beliefs underlying the learning process. A gender equity curriculum shows the diversity in understanding female characters in a broad sense through instructional textbooks, handouts etc. The content of the course/syllabus have been designed to ensure values and attitudes towards gender equality.

i) Women's Writing by the department of English:

Department of English has women centric paper as per CBCS syllabus which is taught by the faculties of the department. It is recognized as a part of daily teaching and learning process in the CBCS syllabus of the curriculum. This Programme pursues imagination and critical insights into the wide spectrum of human emotions and experiences- nature and culture, identity and sexuality love and peace, history and justice.

Credits: 5 (Theory) + 1 (Tutorial)
Marks: 80 (End-Semester Examination) + 20 (Internal Assessment)

This paper seeks to direct the students' attention to nineteenth and twentieth century writings by women living in different geographical and socio cultural settings. Students will get acquainted with the situationally distinct experiences of women articulated in a variety of genres-poetry, novels, short stories, and autobiography, while the selections from Mary Wollstonecraft-the only 18th century text prescribed, will acquaint students with the ideas contained in one of the earliest feminist treatises of the western world. Apart from an examination of the themes and styles in the prescribed texts, students will be required to engage themselves with the specificities of the contexts from which the texts emerged and also analyze the women writers' handling of the different genres to articulate their women-centric experiences.
Themes: Gender, sexual/textual politics, feminism, body, identity, class, location, voice, space, gender and narrative.

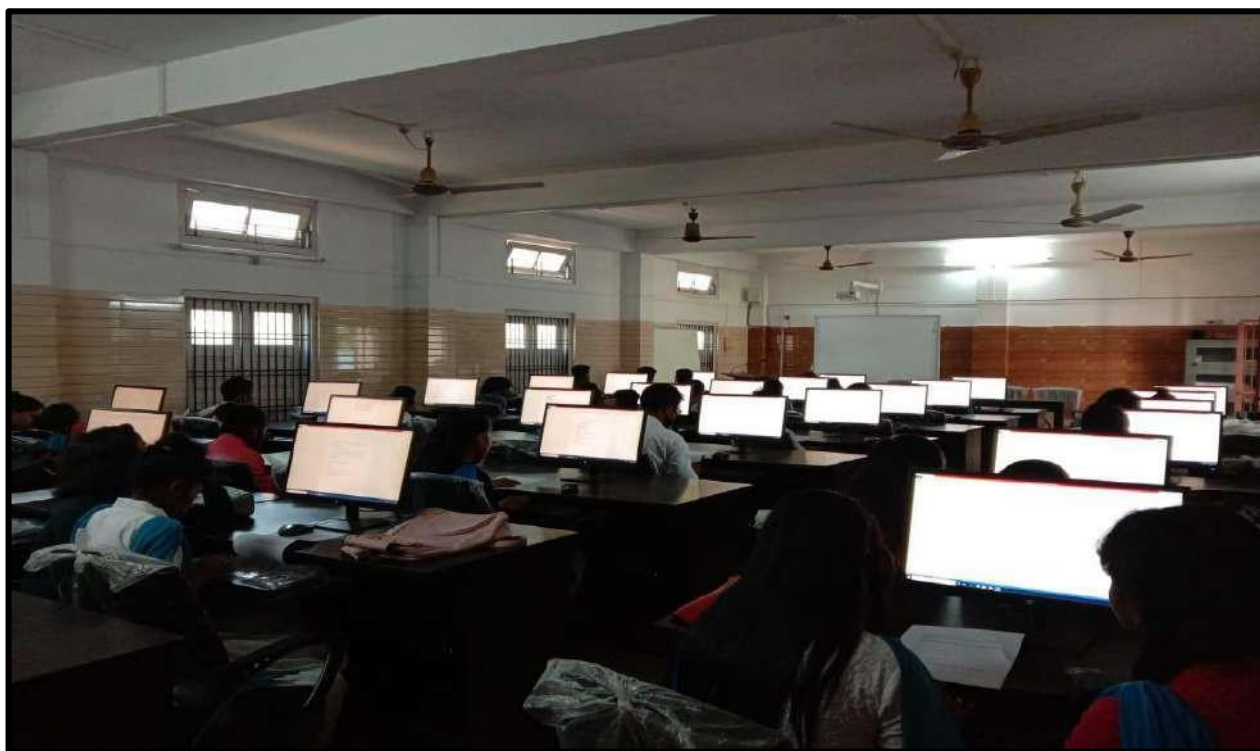



ii) Girls' Hostel:

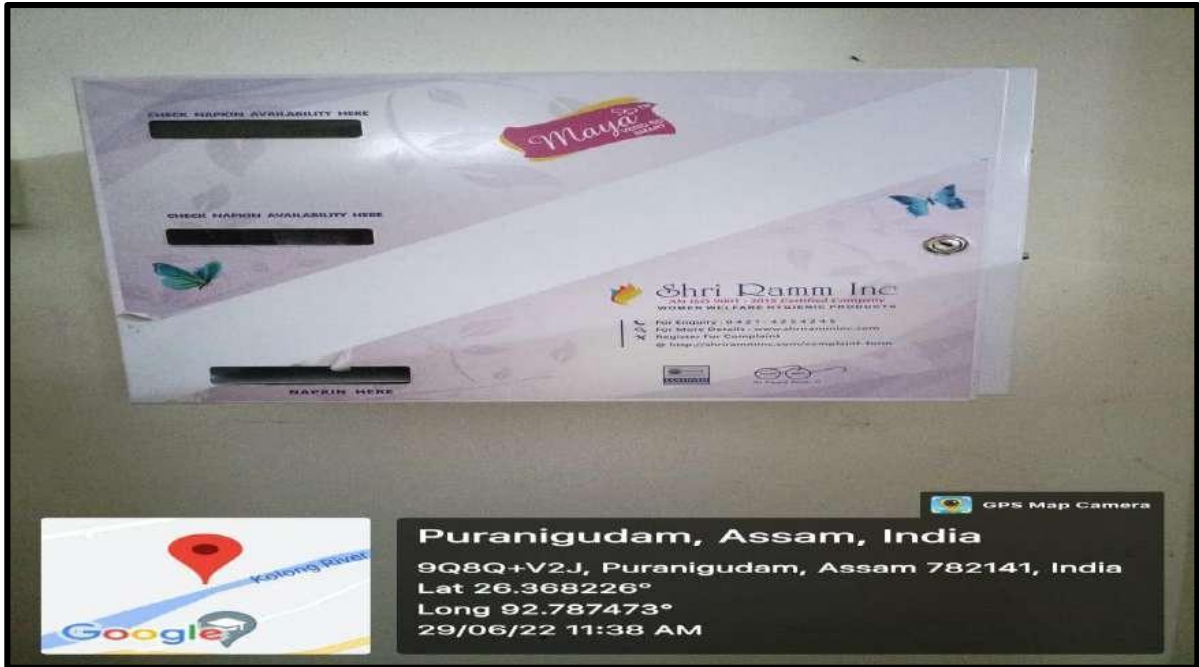

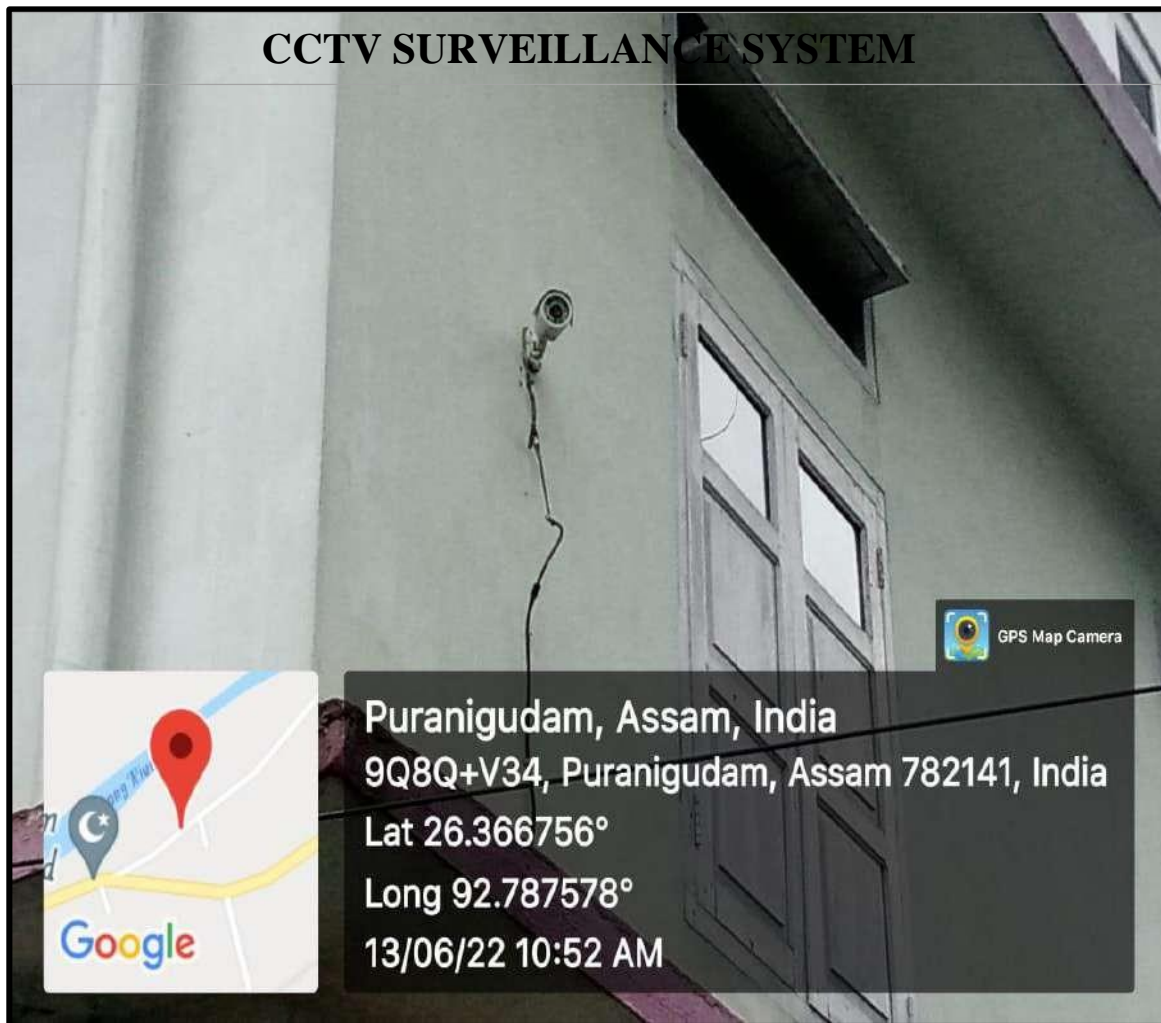

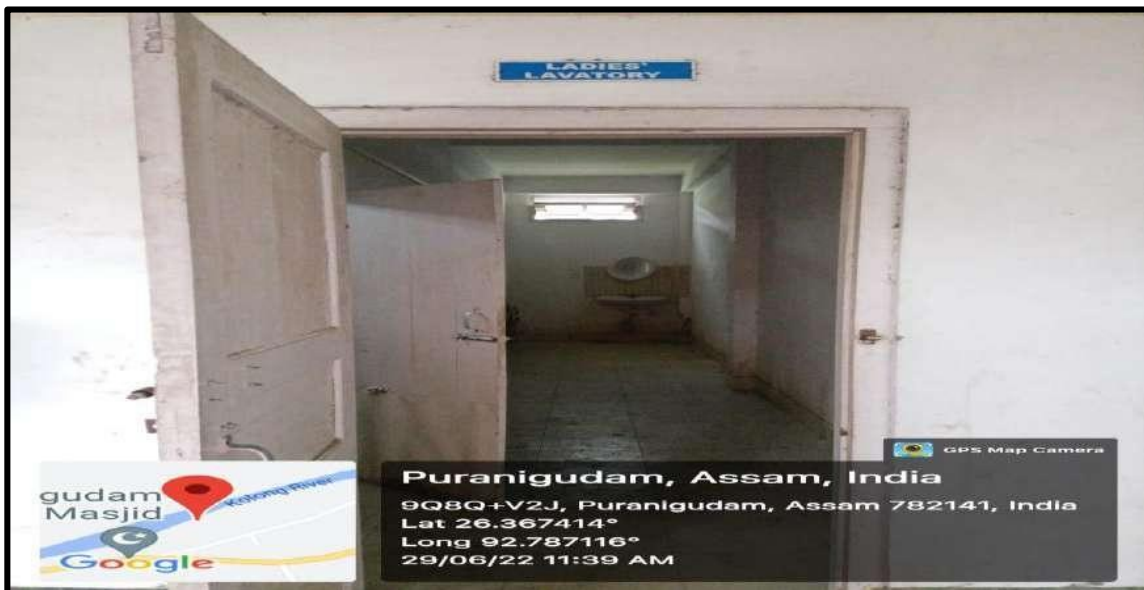

4. Committee/Cell for promotion of gender equity:

The need for gender sensitization has been acknowledged by everyone at Dr. B. K. B. College and actively promoted by several committees and cells. The Women Cell, Women's Aid, Corpus Fund, Poor Fund, Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Cell, Sexual Harassment Cell, ST/SC committee, Minority Committee, Mentor-Mentee and Career Guidance Cell of Dr. B. K. B. College have been involved inculcating the knowledge towards any gender related perspective. In response to safety and upliftment of the students, Sexual Harassment Committee, Corpus Fund, Poor Fund, Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Cell, Sexual Harassment Cell, ST/SC committee, Minority Committee, Mentor-Mentee and Career Guidance Cell are fully functional in the college. Grievance Redressal Cell has been formed to redress the complaints of the students and staff of the college. An anti-ragging committee consisting of faculty members exists to convey necessary action for the students owing to this jeopardy. A sexual harassment committee is constituted with the responsible female and male faculty members to report the incidence of teasing or sexual harassment and to foster an environment where unlawful discrimination are not tolerated.

i) Women Cell & Women Aid:

The Women Cell of the college has rendered financial assistance/reward to the needy one in providing medical help and appreciating excellence in curricular and co-curricular activities. Women's aid was constituted on February 20, 2007 to provide financial assistance to the marginalized/economically weaker students of the college and to the staff of the college in case of emergency. The assistance is given from the monthly contribution of teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The deposited money will be expended among the financially weaker sections to represent their academic matters and medical expenses. The secretary makes an initial investigation and discussion with the mentor of the student and disburses the amount with the help of students' Union.

WOMENS' AID, DR. B.K.B. COLLEGE, PURANIGUDAM

To provide financial assistance to the marginalized/economically weaker students of the college or to the staffs of the college in case of emergency, Women's Aid was constituted on 20/02/2007 in which assistance is paid from the monthly contribution of teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. A meeting was organized in the presence of the committee members of the women's aid on 14th November, 2015 in order to form a committee for designing a policy document for selection of beneficiaries and disbursement of fund for smooth functioning and management of the women's aid fund. In the meeting it was decided to form the working committee of the Women's aid by including the following members.

1. Akashee Bhuyan, Secretary.
2. Other faculties have joined as members.

The various polieles related to the financial assistance are as follows:

- A. The collected and deposited amount of money will be expended among the financially weaker students of the college to address their academic matters, health related medical expenses and accident related medical expenses.
- B. During a specific period of time, only 80% of the total collected amount can be expend to address different issues. The remaining 20% of the fund can be disbursed only in emergency situation after getting approval from the Committee.
- C. In general, the maximum ceiling of financial assistance of the fund is Rs. 5,000/- and it will be flexible on the basis of the seriousness of the problem faced by a student. If sanction of financial assistance has to be increased in any case, then an emergency meeting (formal/informal) has to be organized by the secretary and amount will be fixed in the meeting.
- D. In any emergency situation, the committee can take decisions in presence of minimum of any three members of the committee.
- E. The secretary of the fund may initiate a preliminary investigation before disbursing financial assistance to the students with the help of Students' Union and make a discussion with the Mentor of the student's Mentor-Mentee Group (i.e., BKBIAN Group). (All the

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ii) Corpus Fund:

On April 5, 2014, a Corpus Fund was formed to provide financial assistance to the marginalized/economically weaker students and contractual/adhoc faculties/office staff of the college from the contribution of teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The deposited money will be expended among the financially weaker sections to represent their academic matters and medical expenses.

iii) Poor Fund committee:

Poor Fund Committee of the college has taken initiatives to benefit the economically weaker students of the college to ensure academic upliftment. The committee tries to solve the problems relating to academic matters including admission, examination form fill up, buying books etc. and offer help in kind and cash. The committee welcomes all the financially weaker students of the college who are in need of any financial assistance through application issued by the students. The committee with all the members does scrutiny of the application received on the basis of the family income and the relevant information regarding their mentioned requirements. With the approval from the mentor of the respective students the financial grant is disbursed to the students and proper monitoring is going on for the actual progress of the utilization of the fund.

The Poor Fund of Dr. B.K.B. College, Puranigudam was formed in order to provide financial assistance to the economically weaker students of the college or students living Below the Poverty Line (BPL) for their educational upliftment. Accordingly a meeting was organized in the presence of the Principal and other faculty members of the college on 15th February, 2003 in order to form a committee for designing a policy document for selection of beneficiaries and disbursement of fund for smooth functioning and management of the poor fund of the college. In the meeting it was decided to form the working committee of the Poor Fund by including the following members.

1. Principal of the College, Chairman,
2. Vice Principal of the College, Member
3. Three faculty members of the college.

From the time of the inception, the Poor Fund has been playing an important role and providing financial assistance to the economically backward students of college for their all kinds of educational requirements.

Presently the Committee of the Poor Fund consists of the following members-

1. Dr. Nripen Ch. Das (Principal), Chairman
2. Dr. Kamal Ch. Saikia (Vice Principal), Member
3. Biju Borah (Faculty Member), Joint Coordinator

The Committee formulated the following procedures or policies in order to select the beneficiaries and disburse fund to the students for the smooth functioning of the Fund.

1. Applications are called at the beginning from the financially weaker students of the college asking for financial assistance to solve their academic matters, like admission, examination form fill-up, buying of books, etc. Here the financially weaker students are identified on the basis of their parental annual income.

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
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2. After the submission of the application form by the students mentioning their financial requirements the application form will be scrutinized by the working committee of the poor fund. Here the applications will be scrutinized on the basis of the parental annual income and the relevance of the requirements.
3. After scrutinizing the application forms by the working committee it is forwarded to the mentor of the students for final verification and approval
4. Once the application is verified and approved by the mentors of the students the financial grant is disbursed to the students.
5. After the disbursement of fund to the needy students the working committee monitors and reviews the progress for the proper utilization of fund.

iv) Students' Grievance Redressal Cell:

The Grievance Redressal Committee of Dr. B.K.B. College has been formed with faculty members as per the UGC guidelines to redress the grievances of both the staff and the students. v) Anti-Ragging Cell:

The IQAC Cell of Dr. B.K.B. College has taken an initiative in organizing an orientation cum awareness programme on Anti Ragging. The Anti-Ragging Cell of Dr. B.K.B. College has organized an orientation cum awareness programme on menace of Ragging and its legal

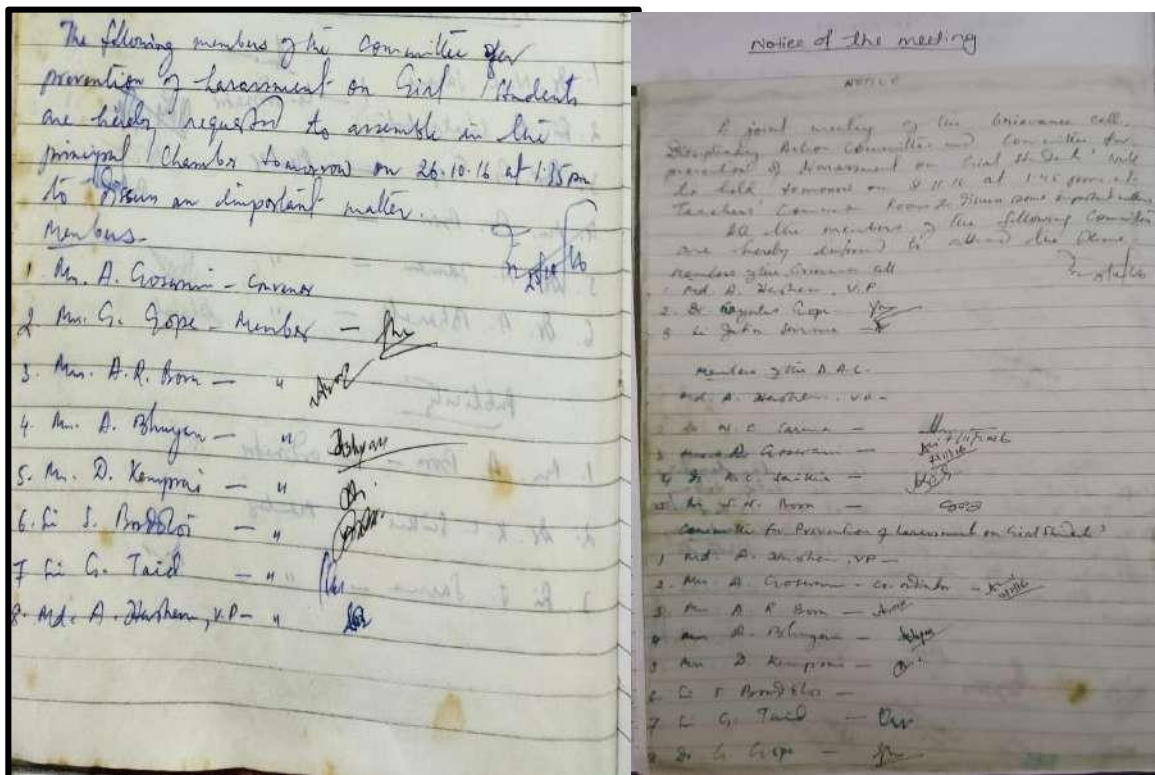
consequences of involvement in such activities on 5th August, 2019. Dr. Nripen Ch. Das, Principal of Dr. B.K.B. College, few members of IQAC and Anti-Ragging Cell are present in the programme. Dr. Das has addressed the students and briefed them about the different strategies and action plan for curbing the menace of Ragging in the college campus by adopting various measures and activities. He also reiterated that anyone who is actively or passively, or is a part of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished. The members of the IQAC and Anti-Ragging Cell also delivered lectures on nuisance of Ragging and its bad effects on students' academic life and about 180 students of the college are present at the programme.



vi) Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell:

As per the directives of the Supreme Court and UGC, Dr. B.K.B. College has constituted the Sexual Harassment committee. The Committee aims to evolve a mechanism for the prevention and redressal of sexual harassment cases and gender based violence in the institution. In the very beginning of every academic session, a meeting with all the respective members of the cell held with resolutions to take actions against any unwelcome and inappropriate sexual remarks/social situation. At the onset of the celebration of International Women's Day, the invited speaker and guests speak about the issues of unwanted sexual behaviour to promote a social and psychological environment at the college that will raise awareness about sexual harassment in its various forms. The girl students at primary level are

taught about Good Touch and Bad Touch in every outreach extension activities that commenced in various remarkable days/events.



vii) Mentor Mentee Groups:

The college has also a mentor mentee program which plays a significant role in building confidence and skill development. The mentors make themselves aware of students' needs and recommend formal counseling if necessary. All the mentors of the college have arranged mentor-mentee meetings to discuss different problems related to the academic matters, curriculum coverage, health related issues, financial conditions of the families of the students, issues related to text and reference books, etc. of the mentees during the session. The objectives of the mentor mentee system include-

- To provide assistance to the different academic, health, financial problems faced by the students
- To provide emotional support and guidance to the students
- To encourage an approachable environment for the students
- To practice healthy teaching learning process

- To bridge the gap between the students and faculty

viii) Career Guidance Cell:

The Career Guidance and Committee Placement Cell of Dr. B.K.B. College has been established to address the diverse socio-economic challenges and geographic backgrounds of the heterogeneous population of students vis-a-vis equity of access and placement opportunities through availability of appropriate institutional support information. The main objective of the cell is to provide relevant and accessible information coupled with professional guidance to achieve better career opportunities outside the classrooms and help the students in their healthy academic progression. Career counseling workshops are organized by career guidance cells providing the students information on career opportunities in their particular area.

5. Extension Activities (Within Campus) for promotion of Gender Equity:

Dr. B. K. B. has taken initiatives to organize various interactive sessions, webinars and talks from time to time to create gender awareness among students. The Women Cell, NSS, NCC and various departments play a significant role in raising gender sensitivity on campus by organizing various programmes in the form of talk, lectures, and conferences to engage the students in open discussion and think critically various issues related to gender. International women's day is also celebrated every year by the women Cell of the college in a very suitable way. The following activities has been initiated by the institution in the peripheral area of the college-

- a) Lecture Programme on 'Technology and Gender Equity' on the occasion of International Women's Day
- b) Inauguration of vending and inclinor machine to ensure hygiene of the all concerned
- c) On the occasion of International Human Rights Day 2022, a lecture programme on 'Dignity, Freedom and Justice for all'

6. Scholarship and Financial Assistance:

Higher education is a key factor for empowerment and socio-economic change. Scholarship in education institution incorporates openness in educational resources, and research environment. Incentivizing girl child education through free-ship/free education creates an atmosphere of gender inclusivity. Scholarship opens the door to encourage girls to challenge gender stereotypes they are facing since childhood. More than four thousand students have got financial assistance in the last five years under free ship/scholarship schemes of State/Central Govt. and from institution itself under the heads of Poor Fund, Women's Aid, Corpus Fund, and Scholarship for Excellence in Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Activities.
