PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Introduction:

Dr. B.K.B. College established in 1967 has gradually emerged to a premier institution of higher education in a rural ambience. This centre for higher education accredited with Grade A by NAAC in 3rd cycle assessment in 2023 came into being under the able leadership and guidance of the leading citizens of Puranigudam. It was, in fact, a very adventurous project to which all the people rich and poor contributed at their own strength. Dr. B.K.B. College owes a great deal to those dedicated souls trying every plan to realize a long-cherished dream. We take pride at their noble efforts.

The college is named after Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua-a dedicated teacher, folklorist, research scholar and a renowned literateur of Assam who was born in the famous Kharangi Barua family of Puranigudam. Dr. B.K.B. College has successfully come through the 1st national accreditation programme in September, 2004 initiated by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and was re-accredited by NAAC in January, 2011. The college celebrated its Silver Jubilee 1993 and Golden Jubilee, 2017. Both the events particularly the Golden Jubilee were celebrated with memorable events amidst enthusiastic response from all the stakeholders, student and alumni. The college campus maintains an excellent environment for teaching- ICT aided classrooms, computer lab, library and a mechanism of curriculum extension interface. Evergreen trees, flower gardens and the Kolong River at the back of the college auditorium adds to its beauty. A new integrated course B.A.B.Ed. under ITEP is going to be launched from the session 2026-2027.

Vision:

To impart higher education in Higher Secondary (H.S.) level and Under Graduate (UG) level to the cross section of learners (basically belonging to the socio-economically backward communities) at an affordable cost through a syllabus designed by the ASSEB and Gauhati University and a curriculum- extension interface at our own initiative.

Mission:

1. To generate knowledge and develop cognitive abilities through well planned curriculum, co- curricular and extra-curricular activities, innovations in teaching learning environment and evaluation procedure.
2. To inculcate values and preserve socio-cultural identities, ensure equal development and to foster a sense of belongingness to the Nation.
3. To create an academic environment for promotion of scholastic and non-scholastic activities.
4. To promote the values of self-sustenance and self-reliance by introducing career-oriented programmes, vocational and cultural workshops, seminars etc. aiming at minimizing the burden of bookish knowledge.
5. To realise social needs and arouse awareness among the students regarding emerging new realities, environmental and other challenges.

WOMEN CELL, DR. B.K.B. COLLEGE

Women Cell at Dr. B.K.B. College was formed in the year 2006, with the aim of empowering and asserting the women to recognise their true potential. Its primary goal is the overall development of women in all spheres - socio-economic, cultural and environmental. It has set the goal of creating awareness about important issues related to women and to provide a forum for discussion and deliberation on a range of issues from empowerment to

environment. The Women Cell displays wall magazine “Shrutosrini” annually. It also published an edited book ‘Women of North East India in 21st century’ in the year 2022. The Cell organized an NCW-sponsored national seminar on “Women in the Unorganized Sector,” with a special reference to North East India, on 25th October 2024. The event saw participation from over 400 attendees on 8th March 2026, Smt. Runima Phukan, retired Librarian, alumni of Dr. B.K.B. College was felicitated to celebrate International Women’s Day.



DR. B.K.B. STUDY CENTRE

Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua Memorial lecture Programme was instituted in 2006 and has been organised regularly since then. The lecture programmes in the even years were organised directly by the College, while those in the odd years were organised by the Department of Assamese of the College until 2016.

In 2016 along with the Memorial Lecture programme, the Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua College Award was introduced as a biennial award conferred by the College.

Subsequently, in 2019, the Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua Study Centre was established following the recommendation of the NAAC Peer Team that visited the college in 2011 during the second cycle of reaccreditation. Since its establishment, the Centre has been organising the programme under its banner in collaboration with various departments of the college.

Named after Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua — a distinguished scholar and a towering personality in Assamese literature, culture, and historical studies during the first half of the twentieth century — the college has consistently undertaken innovative academic initiatives to encourage fresh ideas and critical inquiry in the field of humanities in his memory. The principal objective behind these initiatives is to uphold and promote the core values, pluralistic vision, and intellectual spirit reflected in the life and works of Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua.

The 10th Biennial Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua College Award was conferred upon Sjt. Upendra Borkataki, retired Professor of the Assamese Department of Lumding College, noted journalist, litterateur, and an active organizer. He has authored more than fifty books and has made significant contributions to Assamese literature and journalism.

On the same occasion, the Dr. Birinchi Kumar Barua Memorial Lecture was delivered by Dr. Moushumi Kandali, Assistant Professor of Cultural Studies at Tezpur University, on the topic “The Dynamics and Nature of Modern Art in Assam” on 10th November 2025.



NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The NCC unit of Dr. B.K.B. College is dedicated to fostering discipline, character, comradeship, secular values, a spirit of adventure, and selfless service among young citizens. Department of Information Technology : B.Voc

Dr. B.K.B. College established in the year 1967 has gradually emerged to be a premier institution of higher education in a purely rural environment. The college offers three year degree course in Arts and Commerce under Gauhati University. Apart from the regular courses ,the college has also introduced several certificate and diploma courses at institutional initiative so that learners can be motivated towards learning some basic skills to enhance employability. The college introduced B.Voc course in Information Technology and Physical education from the session 2020-21 with prior approval from UGC and Gauhati University. With B.Voc course of study being equivalent to the existing degree courses, Dr. B. K.B College has been able to diversify the curriculum with specific focus on skill-based vocational shifts. This has also enabled the institution to prepare for the policy formulations initiated under NEP 2020. The inaugural ceremony of vocational course was held on February, 2021. The ceremony was attended by students and different dignitaries. It is expected that the institution will be able to create more vibrant space for new orientation towards institutional distinctiveness in accepting the emerging challenges. A rural based college has potentialities that can be groomed for generating employable resources. Further, rural students too have to cope up with the emerging challenges implicated in the IT field. FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

HOSTEL :

The college provides hostel facilities for girl students with provision for twenty two inmates. The students belonging to tea-tribe communities get preference. While admitting students the hostel committee concerned takes final decision and will be selected for admission to the college hostel on the basis of merit and distance.



Corpus Fund:

Corpus Fund, formed with monthly contributions of teaching and non-teaching staff of the College, is meant to provide financial assistance to the students belonging to the economically disadvantaged families requiring assistance for medical treatment and academic pursuit. However, the sole responsibility lies with the committee to consider the cases of the beneficiaries and the amount to be sanctioned thereafter.



Poor Fund:

The college has been providing financial assistance to students belonging to economically disadvantaged families from the accumulated fees collected from the students at the time of admission. The office after collecting the forms from the students in the month of November-December submits the same to the Poor Fund committee for selecting the beneficiaries on merit cum needs basis.

Central Library:

The college library is enriched with more than seventeen thousand volumes of texts and reference books of eminent authors. The reference books of various kinds have definitely improved the quality of the library. National and regional newspapers, journals & periodicals are available for the use of the students along with a spacious reading room.



Books are issued to the students having library card from 10 A. M. to 4 P.M. The Institutional Repository has been of great help to the students where question papers, reference, books published by the college and faculties along with MPhil Desertations and Ph.D thesis are available. The college has a librarian and two assistants. The College library has been partially automated with SOUL 3.0 software. E-book and E-journals through NLIST & NDLI are also available in the central library.



Book Bank: (Central library)

There is also a Book Bank especially for the poor students in order to provide text books for the entire session. On receiving application a panel of selectors will consider the eligibility criteria and then finalize the list of beneficiaries. We have plans to reshape and augment the existing Book Bank.

Tanusree Hazarika Book Bank:

Tanusree Hazarika Book Bank has been introduced as a separate entity in the central library with donations received from Mr. Pabir Hazarika and Prof. Utpala Hazarika of Guwahati. The Book Bank in memory of their beloved daughter has been carefully groomed to provide all essential text books and references to the students who belong to the economically poor families as per rules framed for this purpose.

Departmental Library:

Each department of Dr. B.K.B. College maintains a small library with facilities of providing books particularly to the students offering major. There are around five hundred to two thousand books including journals in each of such libraries and it has been of great help to the advanced learners.



Scholarship :

All the schemes of scholarship facilities offered by the governments and other agencies are made available to students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBC, MOBC and Minorities. The students must have at least 70% attendance to avail the scholarships.

Central Museum:

The College has taken initiative to upgrade the existing Mini Museum to a well defined Central Museum. A separate room has been arranged for showcasing rare materials of historical and antiquarian interest, art works, manuscripts, traditional garments, etc. Dr. Som Nath Bora has been curating the museum.



Computer Lab:

A well furnished and sophisticated computer lab has been installed with financial assistance under RUSA. Altogether 40 students can attend IT classes with a separate set of computer, ICT facilities, smart board.



College Canteen:

The college provides a well-furnished canteen newly constructed with financial assistance from the state government. All the members of the college community can avail the facility of the canteen installed within its campus. It provides lunch, tea and snacks at an affordable price with the supply of pure drinking water.



College Gymkhana:

The college has a well equipped Gymkhana for physical exercise and body building for the students and youths of the locality. A well trained physical instructor gives necessary training and instruction. The monthly fees for the students of the college is Rs. 50/- and for outside members it is Rs. 100/-. The aspirants need to contact the office of the college in any working day for admission to Gymkhana.



Auditorium:

'Sudhakantha Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Prekshagriha', the auditorium of the college is constructed with financial assistance from Tea Board, India and formally dedicated to the service of the academic community in 2013. Since then the auditorium has been in use while conducting various academic and community oriented programmes such as Freshers' Social, meetings, seminars, workshops, etc. An auditorium complete in itself is an expensive project and still needs further works for completion.

**Open Library :**

This is an innovative practice undertaken by the Dept. of English for promoting reading culture among students. The students can pick up a book at their choice and has no strict rules to be followed. It is literally open where every student is a librarian and a reader at the same time. The Department of English looks after the library and Mr. Jitya Ranjan Saikia, Assistant Professor, English Department has donated two almira for storing books while esteemed donors including eminent ones have donated books.

**Cloth Bank :**

Cloth Bank is an initiative of Department of Education, Dr B.K. B College, Puranigudam. It is a humble attempt to help students in need of clothes to take away with dignity. Any person can donate clean, washed and iron clothes to the Cloth Bank. It tries to spread warmth and love by donating clothes for all- men, women, children and kids. The furnitures of the cloth bank are donated by Dr. Ranjeeta Kakoti, Asstt. Professor in Education Department.

**Other Facilities :**

1. Dr. B.K.B. College facilitates students to participate in various Inter College/inter University competition under parent university.
2. Dr. B. K. B. College periodically organizes Book Fair for the benefit of the students and the people of the local society. We normally invite some reputed publishers cum distributors like Satirtha, Anwasha and Aank Bnaak.
3. Extension Activities (within/outreach): Lots of extension activities within the college campus and outreach programmes are conducted every year with a view to providing real life exposure to students and serving the community as well.
4. The UGC Resource Center/ IT Department imparts basic instruction on computer application and use of e-resources to the students.
5. The GIS facility has already been introduced to the laboratory of Geography.
6. Teaching Learning Material (TLM): Students are provided TLM through whatsapp Groups formed in every department and also through college website. Further e-books, e-journals through NLIST & NDLI, relevent articles for reputed journals, pdf materials for internal sources etc are also made available to the students.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

75% attendance is compulsory for the students of H.S. and degree classes. With any record of attending less than 75% attendance, a student will be declared non- collegiate and in case the attendance falls below 60% he/she will be dis-collegiated. The non-collegiate students will have to pay a fine as fixed by the university while the discollegiate ones shall be debarred from attending the semester-end examinations.

IDENTITY CARD

All the newly admitted students are provided the college identity card. The card needs to be duly filled up and attached with a passport size photograph signed by the Principal of the college. At any time while being present in the college the principal or a teacher is entitled to claim the identity card. In case of missing or getting damaged, a student is required to inform the authority through application and must get it reissued within a month with a fine of Rs.20. Only the identity card holders can contest in the general election of the student's union and claim scholarship.

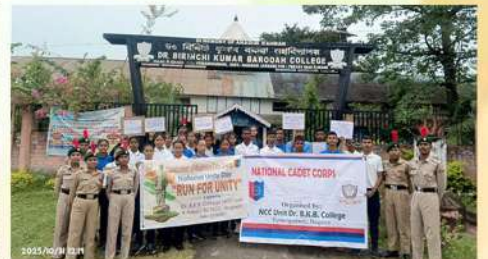
