Introduction:

The students are always considered as a core stakeholder of any academic institution and all the activities undertaken and the facilities provided by the institute are focused on creating a conducive and barrier free environment for them so that theycan excel in their academics. Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is one of the mandatory criteria prescribed by National Assessment and Academic Council (NAAC) in order to measure the student satisfaction level on students' experiences with college facilities. The Student Satisfaction Survey basically highlights on Teaching Learning Evaluation. It collects in-depth information of a wellstructured questionnaire. The responses given by the students are collected, processed, analyzed and presented in diagrams to have a vivid idea about the level of satisfaction of the students which helps in streamlining the services offered to the students. The results of the survey summarize the expectations of the students and experts' educationalists and extent to which the College was able to meet these expectations.

Methodology:

The student satisfaction survey of Dr. B.K.B. college, Puranigudam was conducted and reported by Internal Quality Assessment Cell (IQAC) of the college with support of Heads of all the departments and coordinator of different cells of the college. The well-structured questionnaire including all the dimensions was prepared in the Google forms and circulated randomly among the students with the help of coordinators of different cells and HODs of the departments. Each question in the SSS format is aimed at collecting factual opinion of students on teaching learning and evaluation process including aspects of curriculum, completion of the survey will help the institution to understand both short term and long-term needs of the students and initiate remedial action to improve the facilities. The outcome of this survey will provide a base for planning for the future.


Analysis and findings:






1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?




2. How well did teachers prepare for the classes?


3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?




4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as


5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers




6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?


7. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.






8. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for students.




9. The institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcome and programme outcomes.






11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.




12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.





13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level challenges.






15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.



17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.






18. Efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world work.

19. What percentage of the teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.







20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good.


21. Have your departments conducted Online Classes during the holidays/summer vacation/winter vacation/study leave?






22. Have you participated in the Online Classes?






23. Are the Online Classes fruitful for you?




24. Have your teachers provided study materials or any other e-resources according to your curriculum?




25. Have you faced problems in participating Online Classes?




26. Have your teachers assigned any home work/assignment/open book examination during the period of online classes (Work from home)?




27. How do rank the Online Classes taken by your teachers?




28. Have your college organized any orientation programme for your Examination, uses of library, anti-ragging etc.?


29. How do rank the toilet facilities provided to you by the college?





30. How do you rank the drinking water facilities provided by the college?



Key findings from the survey:

- A. A high percentage of students (84.5%) have confirmed the completion of 85 to 100% of syllabus in our college. Again 15% students reported that 70% to 84% of syllabus was covered and a meagre percent i. e. 0.5% of the respondents reported the completion of 55 to 69% of syllabus.
- B. Students have expressed overall positive satisfaction regarding the teachers' preparation, teachers' ability to communication and teachers' approach to teaching.
- C. Students have also appreciated the teacher's attitude towards teaching, fairness in evaluation and teachers' involvement in the performance of the students' assignments.
- D. Students have expressed that teachers discuss their performance in assignment every time with them.
- E. A high percentage of students (49.50%) reported that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilities them in cognitive, social and emotional growth. Again, 77% students reported that the institute regularly takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities for them.
- F. 55% students strongly agreed and 40% agreed that the institution provide them multiple opportunities to grow and learn.
- G. A high percentage (73.50%) of students reported that the teachers identify their strength and encourage them with providing right level of challenges. Again, they stated that teachers are also able to identify their weakness and help them to overcome them.
- H. 64.50% students have strongly agreed and 33% students agreed that the institution makes effort to encourage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. Again, a good number of students (67%) reported that the institute/teachers use student centric methods, such as experimentallearning, participative learning and solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.
- I. The college provides ample opportunities for extracurricular activities like cultural activities and sports activities. The students have expressed that

college also provides opportunities for development of soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work. The students have expressed satisfaction regarding the mentorship programme, skill development programme run by the college.

- J. Students also appreciated the use of ICT in teaching and regular organization of online classes during the holidays/summer vacation/winter vacation which were highly fruitful for them as reported. Again, a very high percentage of students (95%) have confirmed that the teachers assigned them home work/assignment/open book examination during the period of online classes.
- K. 98% of the students mentioned that the college have organized orientation programme for their examination, uses of library, anti-ragging etc.
- L. Regarding the infrastructural facilities 42% students reported excellent on toilet facilities and water supply facilities.
- M. Regarding the price of canteen,51.5% students have reported normal and 43% have expressed the quality of foods as very good.
- N. 42.50% and 31.50% have expressed the drinking water facility as excellent and very good.
- O. Regarding initiatives adopted by the colleges for the cleanliness of the classroom campus and greenery of the campus, 52% students have expressed excellent and 42% have very good.
